**Stepping Stones Museum for Children to Host Groundbreaking
Celebration**

Saturday, March 14 at 9:30 am

*Unveiling of Children's Community Mural, "Touch-a-Truck" Opportunity,
"Sneak Peek" of Expansion and Free Admission till 11 am*

Norwalk, CT (February 26, 2009) — Stepping Stones Museum for Children, a private, non-profit organization, will host a community Groundbreaking Celebration on Saturday, March 14 at 9:30 am. This momentous event marks the official start of the museum's \$15 million environmentally-focused expansion project,* led by Beinfield Architecture and a host of design partners, that will allow the museum to realize its vision for 2010 and beyond.

In addition to the groundbreaking ceremony with families, board members, community partners, business leaders, the design team, museum staff and Norwalk Mayor Richard A. Moccia, the event will include the unveiling of a children's community mural; touch-a-truck educational opportunities for children; a preview of the expansion model; a musical performance by Patrick Sweeney of the Sweeney Tots; and a giant birthday cake in celebration of the museum's 9th birthday.

There will be FREE admission to the museum between 9:30 and 11 am, with Stepping Stones construction hats for children while supplies last.

"This groundbreaking celebration will showcase the many ways that our museum and the community are growing together," said Rhonda Kiest, executive director, Stepping Stones Museum for Children. "It is the beginning of many celebrations over the next 18 months as the museum grows and continues to be a strong educational resource for children, families, schools and the community at large."

"On March 14, we will see yet another positive example of what can be achieved when everyone in the community works together toward a common goal," said Norwalk Mayor Moccia. "This could not have been possible without the continued dialogue, commitment and collaboration among city groups, residents, and business and community leaders."

Following the groundbreaking, construction will get under way and is scheduled for completion by the end of December 2010.

“This expansion project is an important milestone for the museum,” said House Republican Leader Lawrence F. Cafero, Jr. “It is also a powerful symbol of growth and innovation for the city of Norwalk, its surrounding communities and the state of Connecticut as a whole.”

Cafero noted that among the most significant aspects of this project is the creation of a pedestrian link between downtown Norwalk and Mathews Park and the park’s cultural institutions, including Stepping Stones Museum for Children, Lockwood-Mathews Mansion and the Center for Contemporary Printmaking.

Additionally, other notable elements of the expansion are plans for energy-themed exhibits, programs, classes and special events.

“The museum’s focus on energy-themed education is a concept we [the city and state] fully support,” said State Senator Bob Duff (D-Norwalk). “If children embrace the powerful idea of conservation—and understand their role in protecting the environment—they will become lifelong environmental stewards and perpetuate these values throughout the course of their lives.”

“The ‘learning journey’ for children begins long before they enter school and extends far beyond their years in higher education,” said State Representative Chris Perone (D-Norwalk). “Stepping Stones new phase of development will offer an even greater array of opportunities for youth to learn and grow, preparing them to be a part of a highly competent future workforce.”

***About Stepping Stones Museum for Children’s Expansion:**

*Stepping Stones Museum for Children’s \$15 million expansion will include the addition of 22,000 square feet to the east side of the building in Mathews Park, the addition of new exhibits and program space with a focus on energy-themed education. Outdoor features will include an enhanced courtyard with a tensile structure for year-round programming, a lush community garden for visitors to explore the natural world and kinetic sculptures that introduce renewable energy sources and energy generation principles. The expanded facility will be Gold LEED Certified** and include solar panels, a wind turbine and a green-planted roof.*

****About LEED Certification:**

Developed by the U.S. Green Building Council (USGBC), LEED provides a comprehensive system of standards for environmentally sound practices across all aspects of development and construction.

LEED status is given in four categories—Certified, Silver, Gold and Platinum—which address six major areas: sustainable sites, water efficiency, energy and atmosphere, materials and resources, indoor environmental quality, and innovation and design process. When a building is submitted for certification, points are awarded for compliance in these areas.
